**Worship Night**

**I. Worship in Song** (20 minutes)

- i. Styles of Worship
    - a. A Cappella- Voices only, no instruments. It is always helpful to have someone who is comfortable to lead each verse, bridge, or chorus. Have a TV, projector, or printed sheet with lyrics.
    - b. Instrument Lead- This works well for groups that have people who play an instrument such as the acoustic guitar, box drum, violin, flute, etc. Have a TV, projector, or printed sheet with lyrics.
    - c. YouTube- Play songs (with lyrics) from YouTube. This is a great and easy way to worship together.
    - d. Hymns- This is a more traditional style that is simple, yet beautiful. Have a TV, projector, or printed sheet with lyrics.
    - e. Spontaneous- Moved and aware of Holy Spirit through worship, this time does not need to be structured or prescribe to words and lyrics, but rather, people can freely sing, shout, praise when led by Holy Spirit.
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**II. Lord's Supper** (10 min)

- i. Lord's Supper- Partake in communion together. We encourage you to read through a passage of Scripture and pray, or follow a communion liturgy.
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**III. Worship in Prayer** (30 hour)

- i. Types of Prayers
  - a. Confession- Repenting of pride, anger, anxiety, lust, self-centeredness, and more before God, and asks for forgiveness of any wrong doings done to others or forgiveness needed to be offered to others for the wrong done to you.
  - b. Praise- Acknowledging God's greatness, expresses gratitude and admiration for who He is.
  - c. Thanksgiving- Thanking God for what has/is/is going to do in your life, family, friends and church.
  - d. Intercession- Praying on behalf of another person, group, situation, church, or community.
  - e. Lament- Expressing grief, anger, or frustration that moves you toward God in times of suffering.
  - f. Laboring- A fervent, passionate, and persistent plea to God on behalf of a situation or person, usually involving a sense of urgency and deep longing.
  - g. Listen- Taking time to sit still and wait upon the Lord. Ask Holy Spirit to speak to you.
  - h. Laying of Hands/Healing- A prayer of physical (injuries, diseases, disorders) , spiritual (unforgiveness, guilt, shame, and distorted beliefs), and emotional (memories and emotional wounds from the past) healing.
  - i. Praying Scripture- A prayer that uses Scripture in part or whole as their own words.
  - j. Men and Women- To make people more comfortable to share and go deeper, it is always okay to break into a men and women's group for prayer.
  - k. Communal- It is also vital that everyone's prayers together as a collective.
  - l. Prayer Wheel- 12 types of prayer, put on a time clock, and rotated through.
