411 is a tool that answers four questions, in less than one hour, using one sheet of paper.


Intro

Read Matthew 28:18-20. We see Jesus tell His followers to “Go” and “Make disciples”. A very helpful way to obey Jesus’ command and teach others, whether a brand-new believer in Jesus or someone who has been following Jesus for years, is to answer four questions: Why, Who, What, and When.

Action: Get a piece of paper, fold it in half, hotdog style. Now, each of the four section (front, back and two middle) we will answer the four questions.


1. Why

Why do we make disciples? Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-20. Making disciples is part of our new Identity. We see that once we begin to follow Jesus, we are given a brand-new life, His life; and new identity, as an ambassador. We cannot separate these two, which means making disciples is part of a Jesus follower’s new identity.





2. Who

Who do we reach? We make disciples of anyone who is willing and wanting to learn and follow the Way of Jesus. Create your **Oikos Map** (Click to learn how to make an oikos map). This is a helpful tool to begin to think of people who are far from God that you can begin to prayer for and eventually share the gospel with.



3. What

What do we share with someone? When sharing with people, we must always make it about the good news of Jesus. There are many ways to share the gospel, just read the book of Acts. Specifically, there are two simple and effective tools that will help you share the gospel: your **One Minute Testimony** and **3 Circles** (Click to learn how to share your testimony or 3 circles).



4. When

When do we make disciples? Here, we are going to set some goals that will begin to make their ways into our calendars.

-First, set a time to pray daily for the people on your Oikos Map.

-Second, right down the name of a person or couple people you think need to hear the good news of Jesus, and what day you will reach out to them/ meet up with them to share the good gospel of Jesus.

-Lastly, think of some people that are already following Jesus in your life and ask them if they would be willing to meet with you for **Discipleship** (Click to learn our discipleship making pathway and resources for discipling others). Call them and select a time and place to meet.
